B. Assessment of Fiscal Year 2008 - 2009 Efforts to Meet HUB Procurement Goals

Factors Affecting Attainment:

In fiscal years 2008 and 2009, the professional services goal was not met because the majority of these dollars are paid to medical professionals who have no incentive to become HUB certified; and in construction, the agency had facility projects in rural areas of the state that have few or no available HUBs. In fiscal year 2009, the other services goal was not met because of high dollar temporary employment agency contracts with nationwide locum tenen staffing providers to recruit doctors and other healthcare staff for state supported living centers.

"Good-Faith" Efforts:

Complied with statewide HUB procurement goals per 34 TAC Section 20.13(c), ensured that contract specifications, terms and conditions reflected the agency's actual requirements, were clearly stated, and did not impose unreasonable or unnecessary contract requirements; prepared and distributed information on procurement procedures in a manner that encouraged participation in agency contracts by all businesses; in fiscal year 2009, awarded 323 additional HUB contracts over fiscal year 2008.
